At the end they gave us an evaluation; now I am getting one-on-one training from one of the CV trainers to work on my lowest scores so I can improve in those areas. I hope to keep all these keys in mind for next year's tryouts.

One thing that made State ODP fun was that we got to meet other players in Northern California. It was interesting meeting new people because you got another point of view of how to play soccer. You also got to see the different teams in northern California, and I learned a lot from them. Although we got to meet players from California, it was very rewarding to meet players from different states too. They all had a different style of playing soccer. I learned from these players that size doesn't matter, because no matter how small they were, they played really hard.

ODP means a lot to me because I was able to meet many excellent players and personalities. It also it gave me exposure. For example, I got to meet pro players, and was able to talk to the national coach.
